Mary, this our LE COEUR is yours. May it always remind you and us that we are your Marian Year graduates.

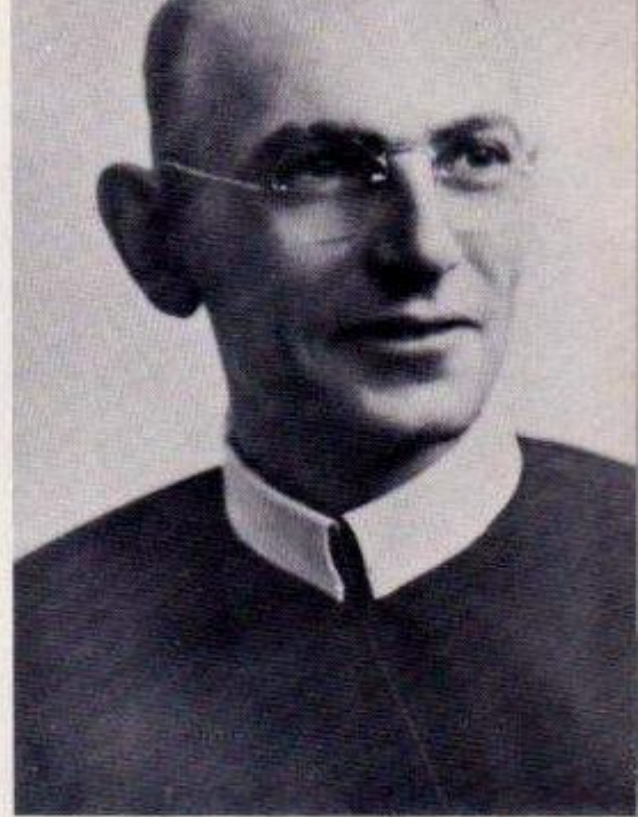

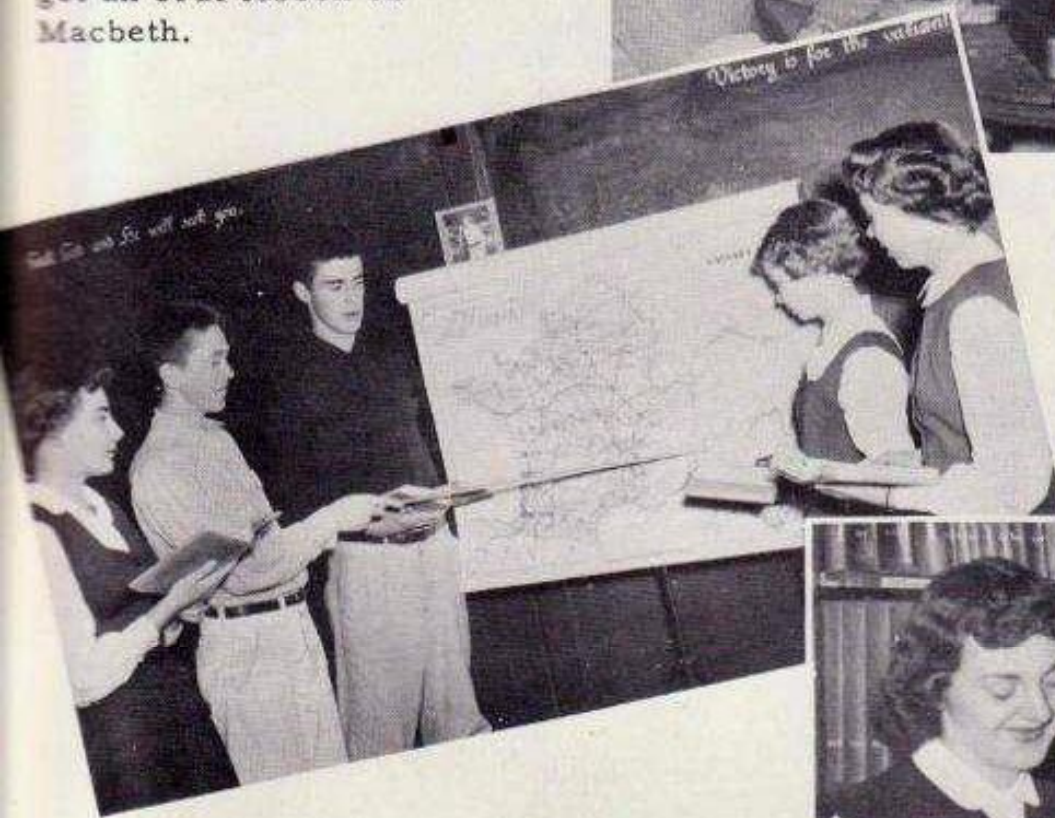

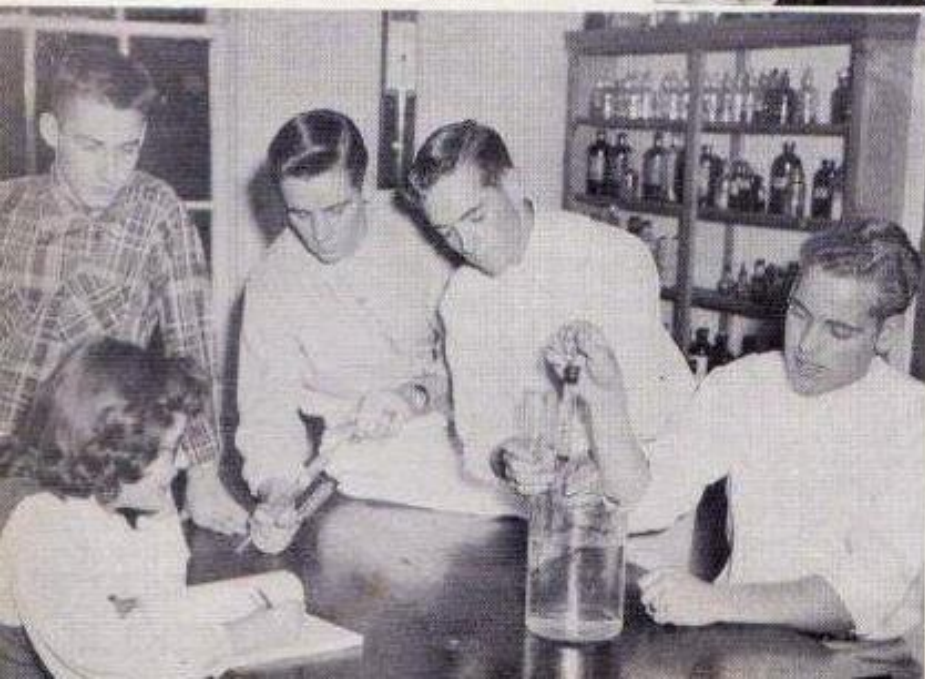

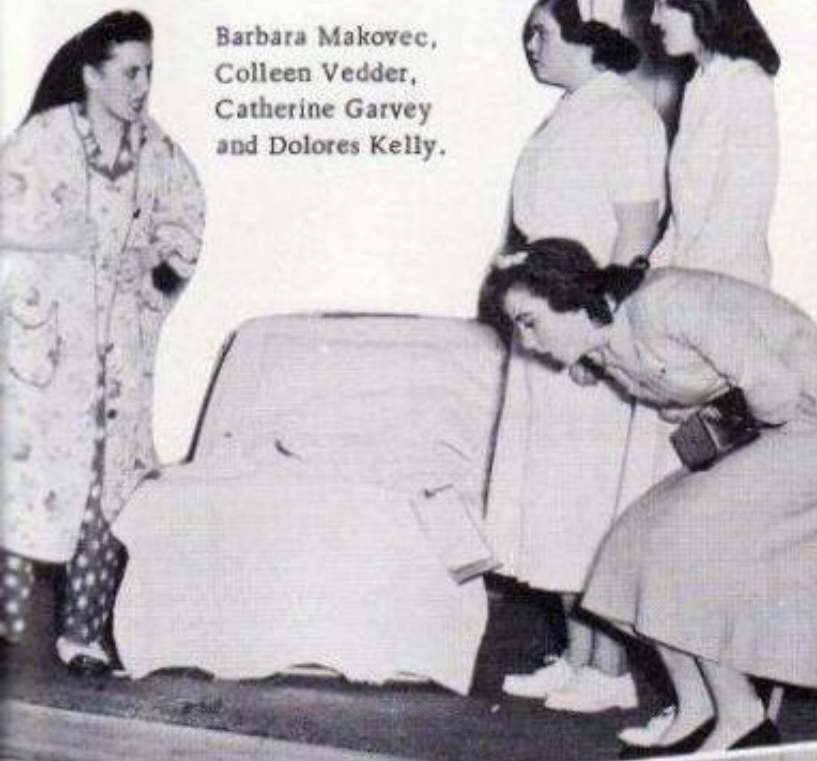

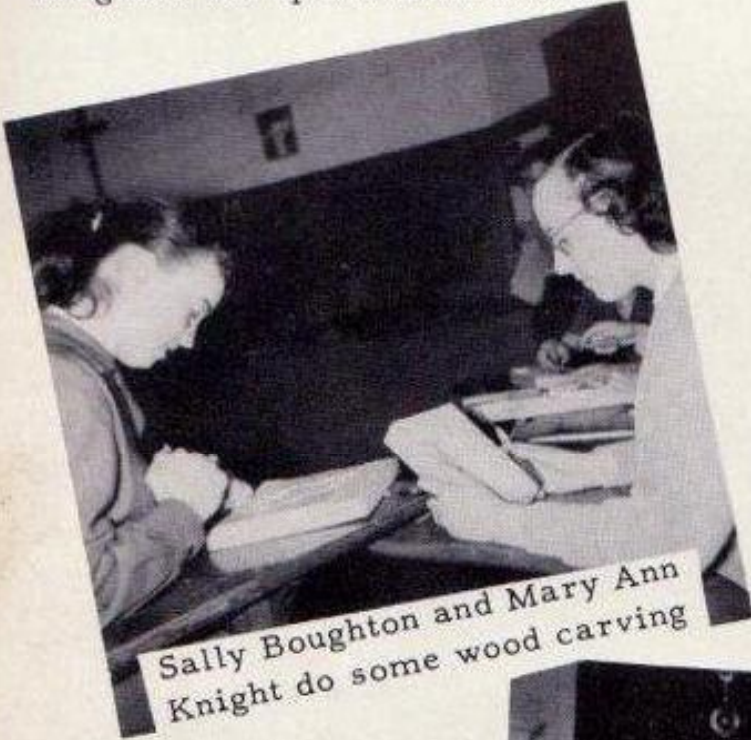
