





## Class History

Our Sophomore year will long stand out in our memories for this was the year that Mother M. Rebecca, Sister M. Barbara, and Sister M. Spiritus came 2,400 miles across the continent just for the unique privilege of teaching us.

Our Junior year brought us closer to Our Lady, for we were accepted into the Sodality. Sister M. Charisse was the moderator.

In February 1957, the Juniors were just bursting with pride for several good reasons. Our Junior Prom was a tremendous success with Queen Mickey Whiteley adding to the "Fantasy." If you happened to see a Junior walking down the hall waving a hand in front of him, he wasn't sleepwalking, just showing off his brand new class ring. And if you think the rest of the Juniors were elated, you should have seen our newly-elected co-editor of "The Laurel", Janis Boyer.

This was the year we sent Dave Kryger and Dick Nielsen to Boys' State, and Jean Macy to Girls' State. The end of the year meant a dinner for the Seniors, and all the Juniors co-operated to make it the best Junior-Senior dinner possible.

And here we are! Seniors at last, but not for long. With the new school came a new faculty member, Sister M. Teresine, and new classmates: JoAnn Hattell, our artist; Jim Yacks, our football manager; and Ted Green, our quiet man. New in the line of athletics was our first ll-man football team and its coach, Stan Sweatte. In clubs we had the first Pep Club with Billie Pendergast as president and the first "A" Club with Ron Scharff, Dave Kryger, and Gary Thompson at its head. Pat Campbell was a faithful member of the square-dancing class on Sunday nights and you could always see Sharon Meyer, Mother's banker, making her regular trips on Friday afternoons to deposit the "loot". Larry Anderson was really the one for asking directions --he always asked the girls. Ardis Engen was chosen to assist Janis Boyer with the job of putting out the school paper each month. At the end of the year, Jean Carlson displayed her genius at the piano when she presented her Senior Recital.

Our Senior year was a pleasant one, as well as a memorable one. We will long remember the Christmas production, "Coming of the King", and the three-act play, "Murder Takes the Veil." Also, our parties and dances will not be forgotten: the Senior Ball, the Football Dance, the Soph-Senior Party, the Junior-Senior Dinner, and the Progressive Dinner.

But most of all, we shall remember that great day, May 20, 1958, when we walked proudly to Bishop Byrne and received our signed diplomas.




