... as OUR LADY OF VICTORY whom we invoke for assistance to overcome all obstacles to success in work and in play.

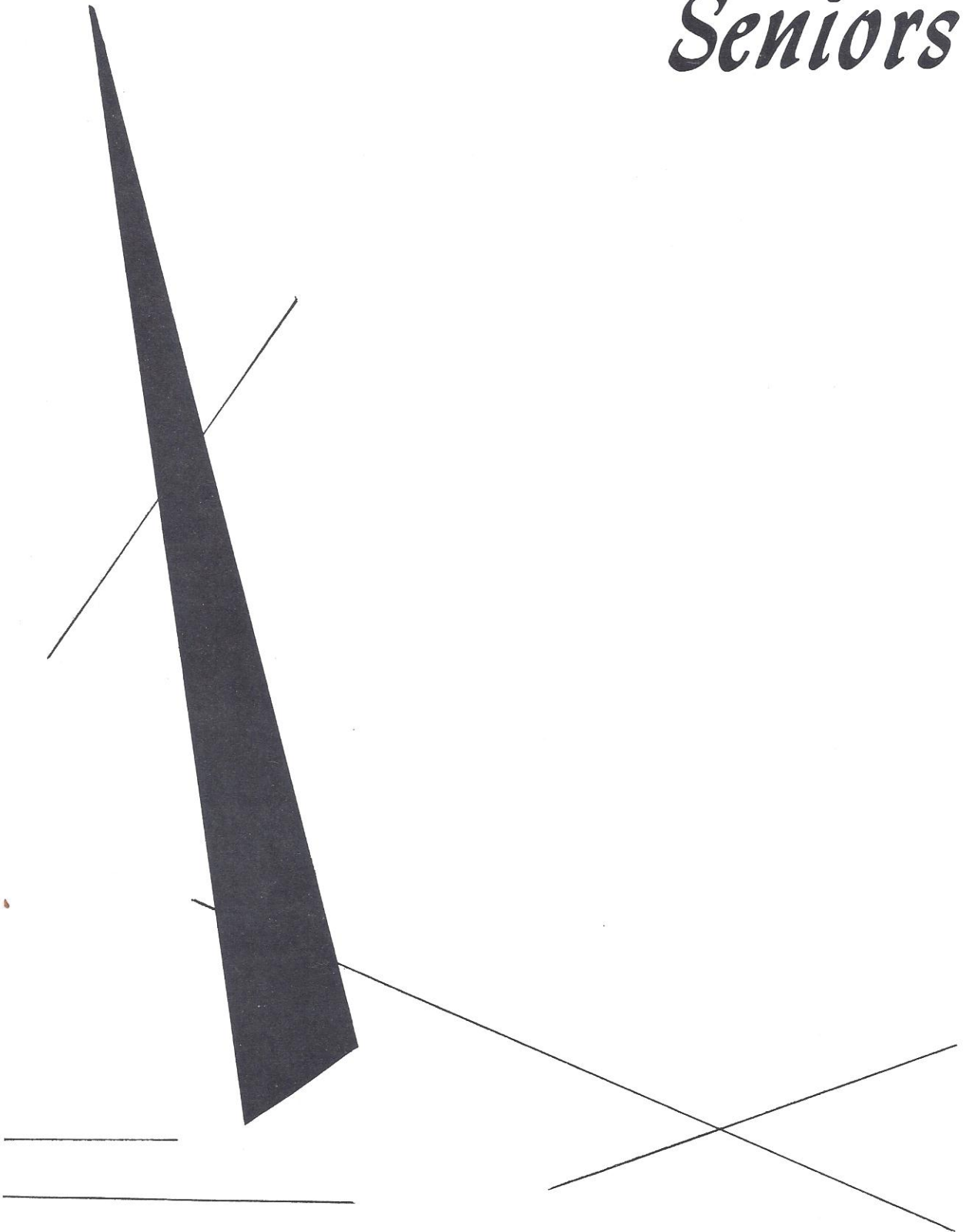
... the MOTHER OF GOD, whom all students address in the Hail Mary which begins each new class.

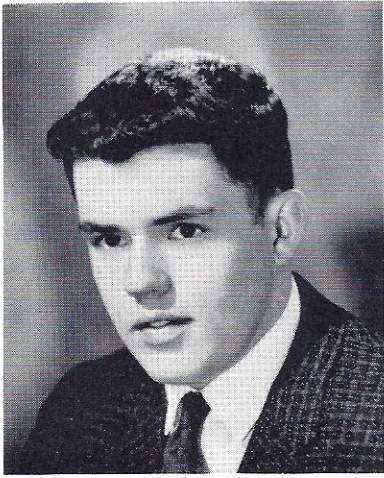

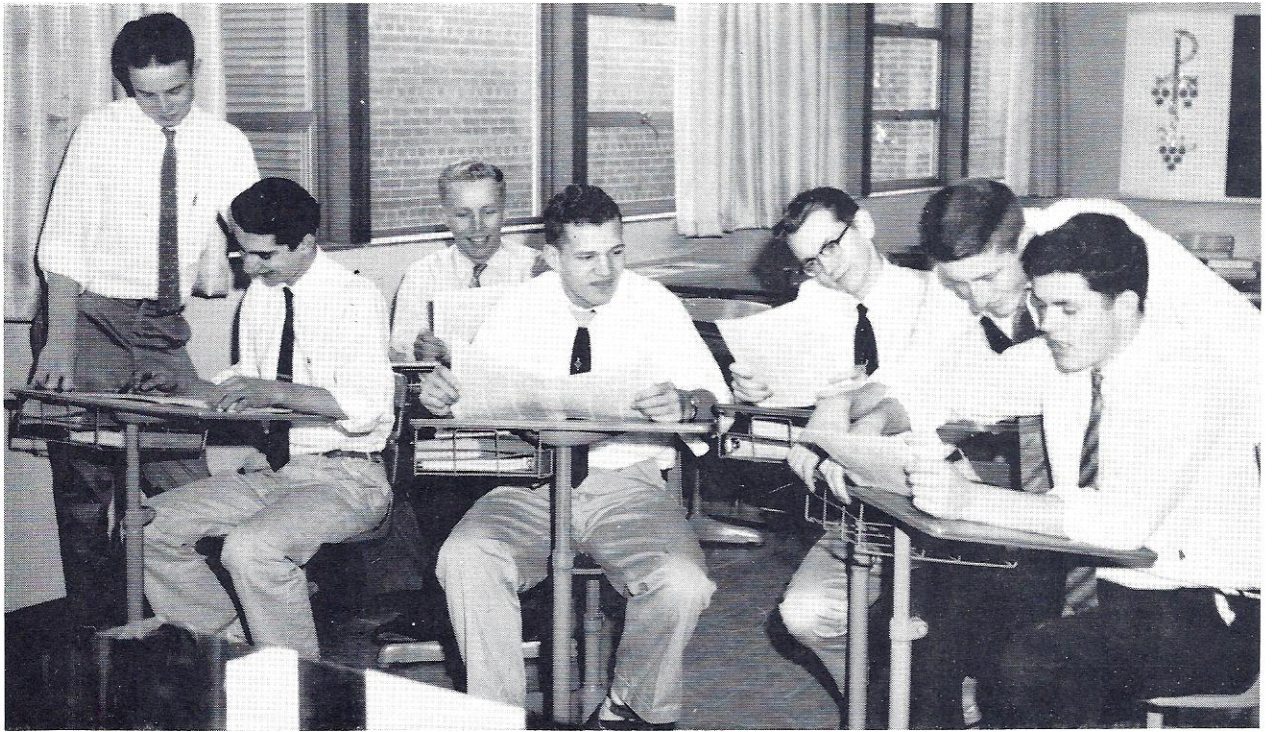

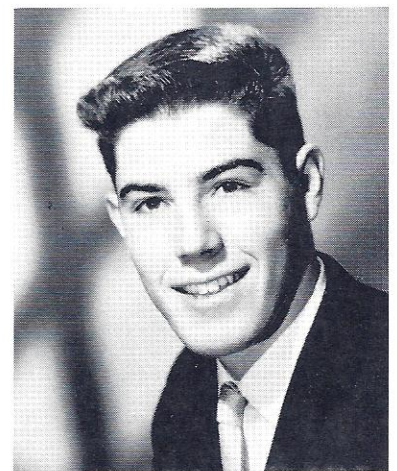

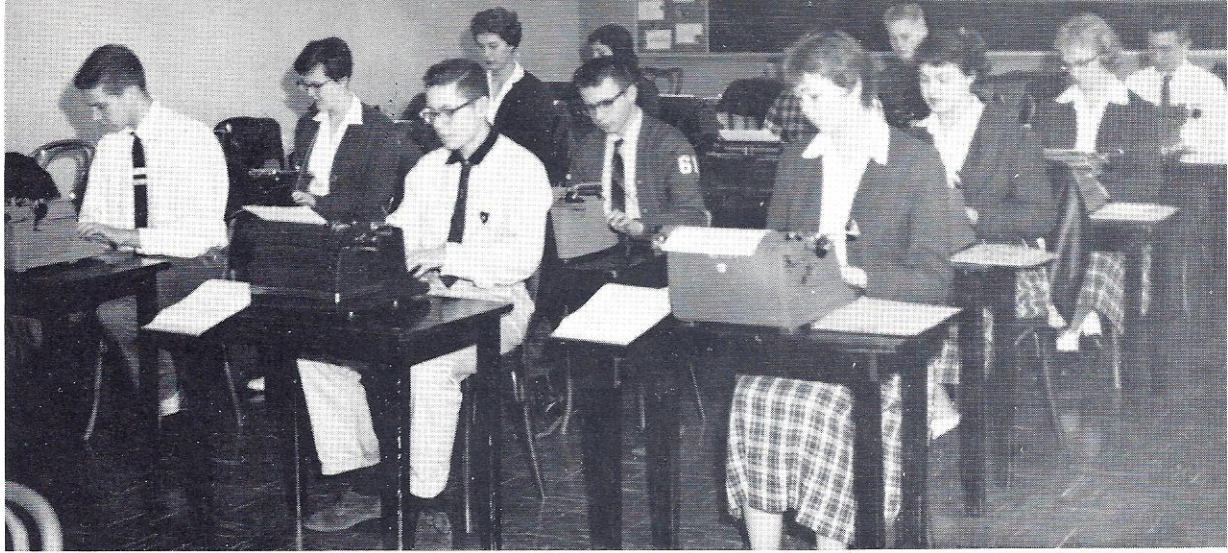

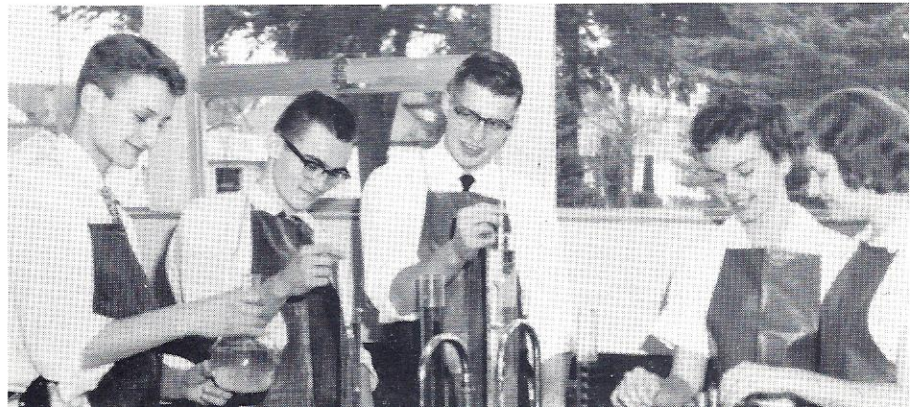

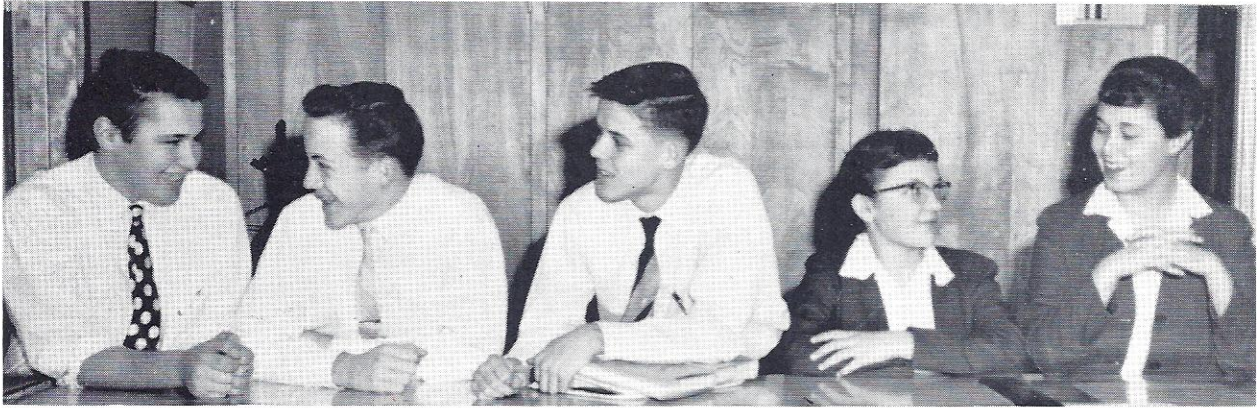

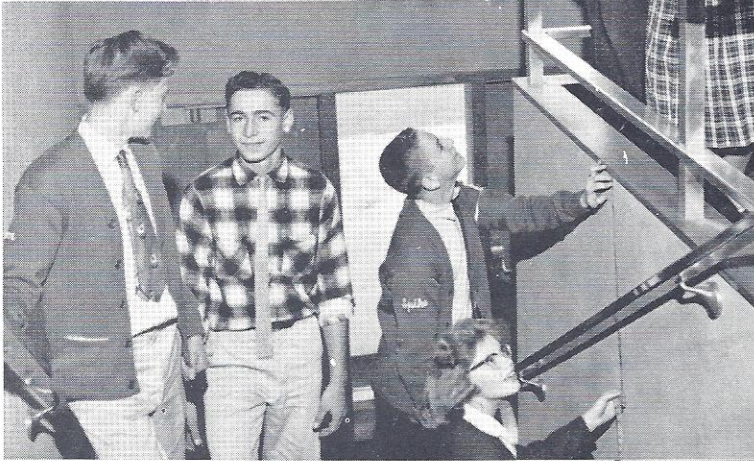

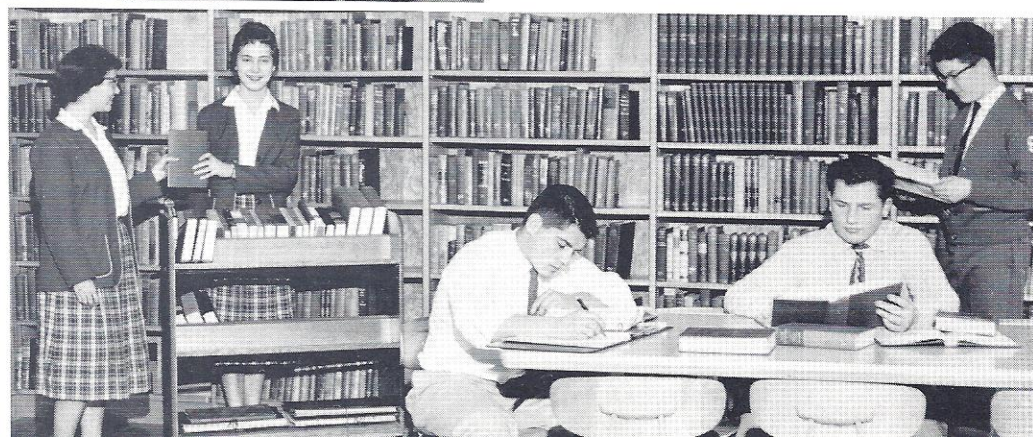

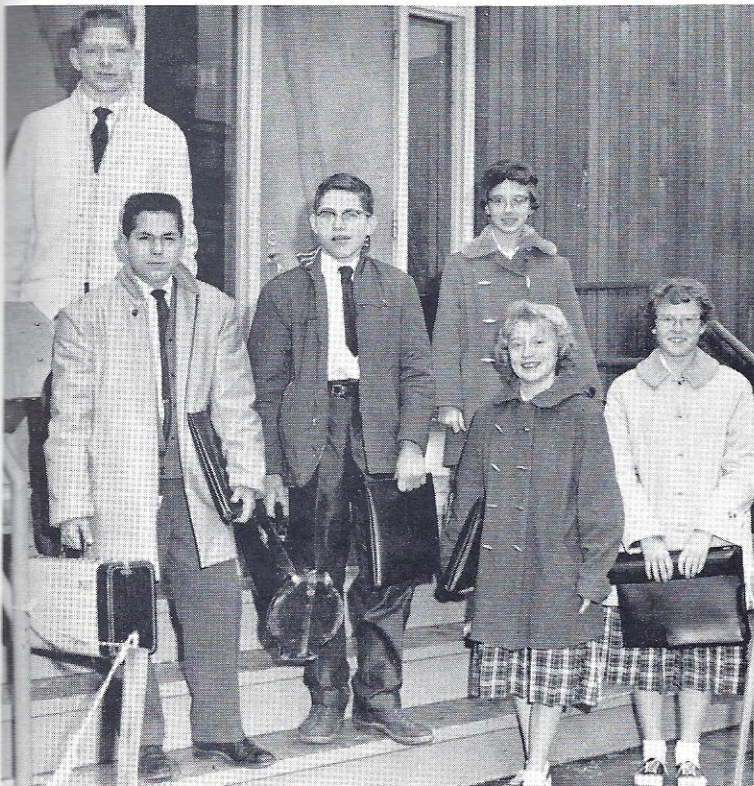

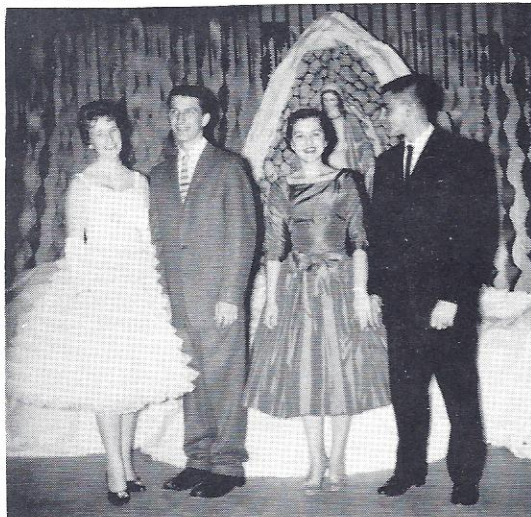

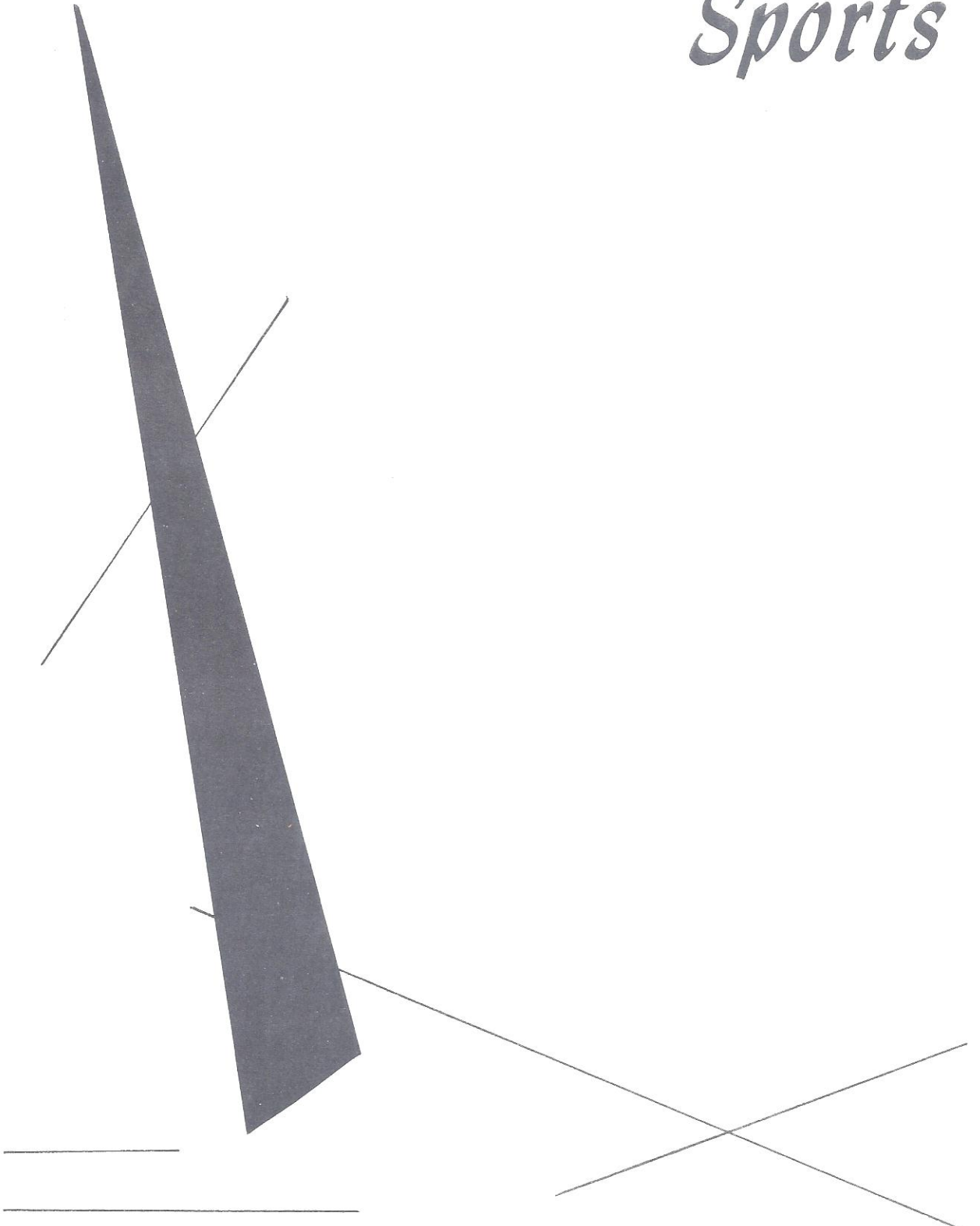

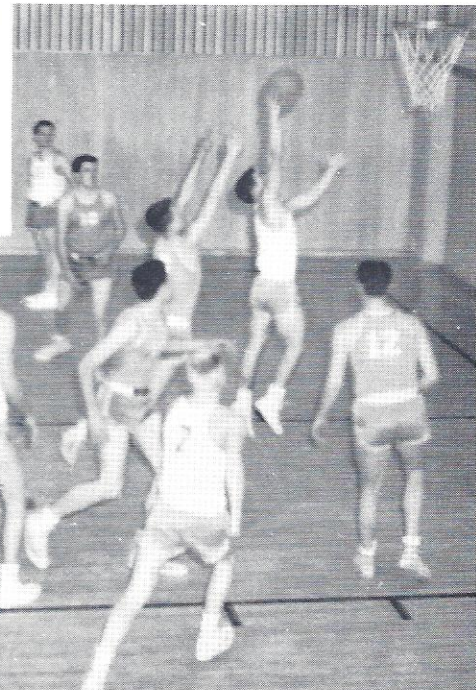
