

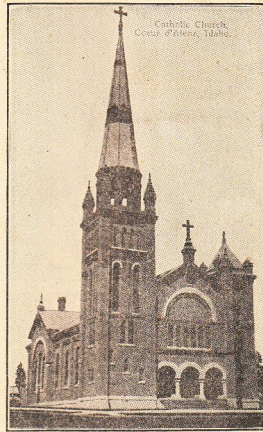

ACADEMY NOTES

The annual commencement exercises of the Academy of the Immaculate Heart of Mary were held Sunday afternoon, June 14, from St. Thomas church, Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. Rt. Reverend Daniel M. Gorman, D.D., Bishop of Boise, presided at the affair and Reverend Father Schermanson of Wallace, a former pupil of the academy, preached the baccalaureate sermon. After the awarding of the diplomas Rt. Rev. Daniel M. Gorman spoke a few words of congratulation to the graduates. Reverend Father Schermanson spoke to the class of the fond memories and the gratitude that he as well as they should have of Sister Mary Clement, the foundress of the Academy, and of Father Purcell, who had been the inspiration of so many of those who had gone through the school. He told them that as they stood at the commencement of their lives, ready to embark on an unknown future, they should profit by the experience of their parents, their priests and the teaching of our Holy Mother, the Church. The speaker pointed out to them what their legitimate desires might be: Length of days, a happy home, friends and the accomplishment of something in life, but above all their desire should be that of honoring and serving God. These things could be obtained only by making the proper use of victory. Now that the first victory had been achieved in their graduation, they would have to learn the proper use of victory by the completion of their education, if this could not be done in a Catholic college it should go on by their own diligence. He stressed the fact that in the building of their character they would have to keep ever before them the virtues of faith, courage and purity; faith in God and their fellow men, courage in a vision of triumph that comes from making use of big opportunities, and purity in conversation, thoughts and in their dealings with their fellow men. It was aptly pointed out that these things had been tried and had not been found wanting and therefore they must make for success of their lives.
