## ST. THOMAS' PARISH NOTES

School opens September 6th. We trust all of our people will send their children to a Catholic School here or elsewhere. Every Catholic child has a sacred right to a Catholic education and this sacred duty is binding on their parents. Conscience demands its fulfillment. Only the bishop can dispense parents from this obligation, so the law of the Church runs.

Closely connected with this duty is the other to support the Catholic school and its fulfillment distinguishes the real from the nominal Catholic. New envelopes were distributed to take effect the first Sunday in September. The organ fund, the school fund and the cemetery maintenance fund are abolished and all effort will be concentrated on paying off the church debt, which is \$13,500.00.

The debt has hung over the church for some years. Let us make a generous effort to lift it. No new improvements of a notable nature will be made in the church till the debt is cancelled. We sincerely hope every wage earner will apply for a pack of envelopes and do what his or her conscience prompts as their duty to God, their church and their neighborly share of the parochial load. The children, also, will receive envelopes as to the customs everywhere in this country to help pay the Sister's salary which is now quite a burden on the slender resources of the parish. They have five or ten cents for other things, teach them to make a little sacrifice to God and His Church.
