

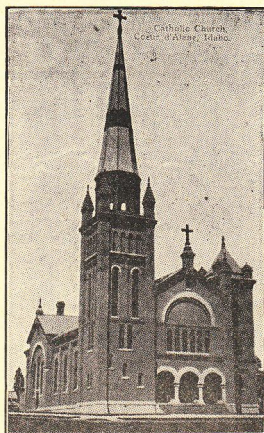

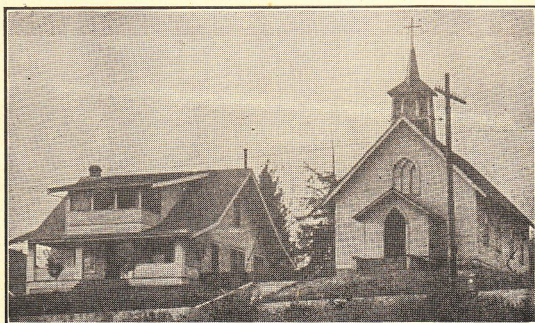

### REDEMPTORIST CENTENARIES

The year 1932 marks a double centenary for the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer. It is the second centenary of the foundation of the Order and the first of their coming to America.

Two hundred years ago this month the learned and holy Alphonsus de Liguori was called by God to be the founder of a new religious order for men. From the small but zealous band of four who formed the first community, the Order has grown to almost 6000 members who labor on five

continents in almost every country on the globe. The church has canonized three of its members and eight bear the title, "Venerable."

The infant congregation met with much opposition, but the very obstacles aimed to crush it caused its spread. In 1832 a call for more priests came from far away America; the Redemptorists, ever imbued with the missionary spirit of their hold founder, gladly answered. Three fathers and three brothers left Vienna on March 6. To American Catholics and to the people of our parish especially, the work of the Redemptorists is well known.

Looking back over the glorious record of 200 years of service, we can see how God has blessed not only the Order but also those among whom the Fathers have labored. "May He keep pure and unearthly the hearts sealed with the sublime mark of His priesthood."

### ORIGIN OF THE WORD CATHOLIC

The first use of the name Catholic was by St. Ignatius, who was born in the year 50 A. D., and died in 107 A. D. He was the Bishop of Antioch in Syria, Asia, appointed by St. Peter, the Bishop of Rome. The name Roman Catholic came into use officially and offensively in Great Britain in the days of Queen Elizabeth. The Vatican Council rejected the name Roman Catholic, and described the Church of Christ as "The Holy Catholic Apostolic Roman Church." The word Roman was to signify that the authority of the Church centers in the Bishop of Rome, who, from the time
