

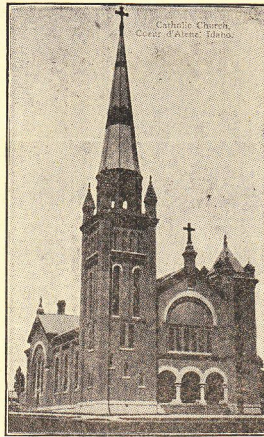

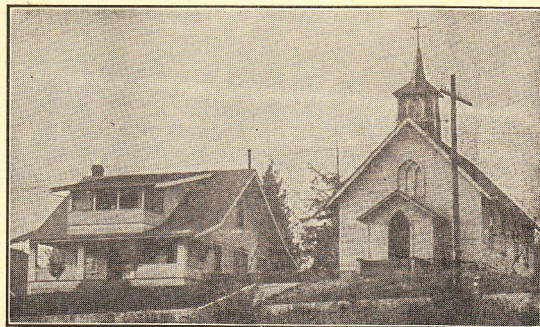

It is explained that the fair is an appeal to the city to assist somewhat in the support of the school, which has given tuition to some 250 to 300 students annually for the past quarter century, and, that the expenses, owing to the tax burden, are difficult to keep up.

The fair, while it will probably realize only a very small amount of the funds necessary to maintain the school, will help in the long run. A variety of booths are being arranged now. #### SICK CALLS

The summoning of the priest in case of sickness should not be unduly postponed. It is a matter of vital importance that the last sacrament be administered while the sick person is in full possession of his senses. The following information should be given when making a call: Is the person in danger of death? How long has he been away from the Sacraments? Is he able to receive Holy Communion.

People unable to attend church should be given the opportunity of receiving Holy Communion frequently during the year. Instead of being an imposition it is a privilege to be the bearer of the Blessed Sacrament, and it is a blessing to the home to which it is brought.
