

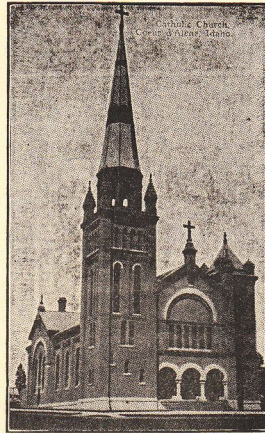

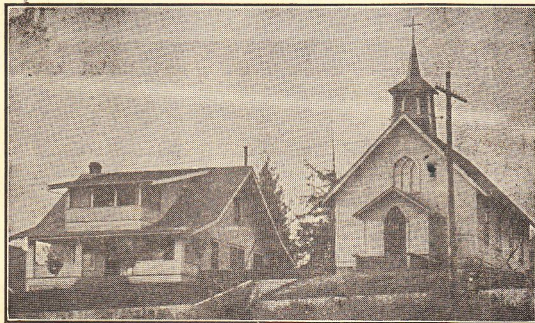

the people with the ostensorium. The covering of the hands signifies that it is not now the priest, but Jesus Himself Who blesses.

That this service must be beneficial, is self-evident. This service usually takes place in conjunction with Vespers or one of the afternoon or evening devotions, though it may follow Mass or be held independently of any other service.

SICK CALLS

The summoning of the priest in case of sickness should not be unduly postponed. It is a matter of vital importance that the last sacrament be administered while the sick person is in full possession of his senses. The following information should be given when making a call: Is the person in danger of death? How long has he been away from the Sacraments? Is he able to receive Holy Communion?

People unable to attend church should be given the opportunity of receiving Holy Communion frequently during the year. Instead of being an imposition it is a privilege to be the bearer of the Blessed Sacrament, and it is a blessing to the home to which it is brought.

GUARD WELL YOUR TONGUE
