

A JOURNEY

Last year two Maryknoll missioners, Father John Tierney, of New York City, and Father Francis MacRae, of Wakefield, Mass., now at work in South China, set out to bring Easter to a group of new converts. Father Tierney describes as follows the return journey:

"The sun that had so kindly favored us on the way up deserted us on the return trip, the clouds gathered, and down came one of China's spring

rains, which lasted all day.

"Before long Father MacRae's chair coolies began to show signs of distress, for carrying 200 pounds in the rain along slippery rice paths, with chair poles sinking into bare shoulders, soon wears out human endurance. Father Mack, having formerly been one of Uncle Sam's heroes who in rain or shine bring letters to their destination, was touched by the appearance of his struggling coolies, so he got out and walked.
