

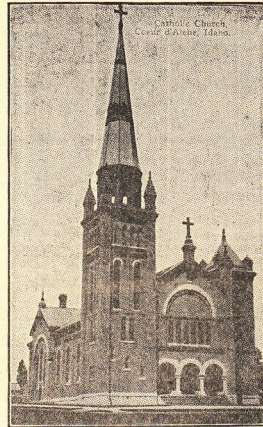

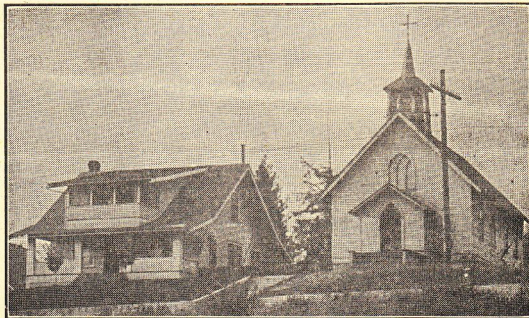

SUNDAY SERVICES

The Sunday Masses during the summer months (July, August and September), 6:00, 8:00 and 9:30. Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament after the 9:30 Mass. No evening services on Sunday.

Week Day Mass, 6:30.

Hayden Lake—Attended by the Redemptorist Fathers. Mass every Sunday at 9:00 during July and August.

Holy Days: 6:00, 8:00 and 9:30. (Benediction after the 9:30 Mass.)

Catechism every Sunday after the 8:00 o'clock Mass. Devotions on Sundays, 4:00 p. m. The Sacrament of Baptism is administered every Sunday after the devotions.

Communion Sundays—

First Sunday of the month, Married Ladies' Sodality.

Second Sunday of the month, Senior and Junior members of the Holy Name Society.

Third Sunday of the month, Young Ladies' Sodality.

Fourth Sunday of the month, Promoters of the Sacred Heart League.

The children receive Holy Communion every Sunday.

On the First Friday: Mass of Exposition, 6:00. The Blessed Sacrament will remain exposed till after the 7:30 o'clock Mass.

Confessions: On Saturdays, Vigils of First Fridays and Holy Days, 4:00 p. m. to 6:00 p. m.; 7:30 p. m.

Mother of Perpetual Help Novena Devotions every Tuesday afternoon at 3:00 o'clock; also at 7:30 p. m.

THE NINE TUESDAYS

The Nine Tuesdays is a special form of devotion to Our Mother of Perpetual Help. It consists in attending the public devotions held at some shrine of Our Mother of Perpetual Help on nine Tuesdays, one following the other without a break, and in worthily receiving the sacraments of confession and Holy Communion at least once during that time. Those making the Nine Tuesdays are urged, when possible, to attend Holy Mass and receive Holy Communion every Tuesday during the novena—if convenient, in their own parish church. If it is impossible to receive Holy Communion on the Tuesdays of the Novena, it might be possible to receive on the Sundays.

The Nine Tuesdays, as a special form of devotion to Our Mother of Perpetual Help, is fast sweeping the country.
