THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY Meditatrix of All Graces

This is one of the titles of our Blessed Mother most recently recognized by official pronouncement of the Church. It is closely akin, in fact one might say, it is the same as Perpetual Help, under a more theological name.

For the name signifies that all graces are, ordinarily speaking at least, given to us by God through the hands of Mary, as it were—or better, that in every grace that is given to us or to any person, Mary's intercession has had its influence.

The streams of grace flow down from Heaven to earth constantly—as constantly as the heat streams from the sun and as invisibly—vet also as really. God is the sole Author of all grace;
