She was very interested in politics and was proud of her involvement and work with the American Party. She loved to read, garden and refinish furniture. When she was able, she loved to get dressed up and go dancing. Her pride and joy was her home where she lived for the last 56 years.

She was preceded in death by Frank Mathes, her parents, sister Bessie Jones and brother Ernest Sharpe. She is survived by two sisters Ellen Nutting and Mary MacDonald and one brother Bob (Marilyn) Cartwright of Kalispell, Montana.
